Bannock County's policy is to collect NO personally identifying information (such as names or addresses) when you visit our website.

If you choose to provide that information to us, it is only used to fulfill your request for information or a service.

Technical Information Collected and How It Is Used

Bannock County does collect some technical information when you visit in order to make your visit seamless. The following section explains how we handle and collect technical information when you visit our website.

Information Collected and Stored Automatically

When you browse, read pages, or download information on bannockcounty.us and bannockcountyeventcenter.us we automatically gather and store specific technical information about your visit. This information (listed below) never identifies who you are.

1. The Internet Protocol address and domain name used but not the e-mail address. The Internet Protocol address is a numerical identifier assigned either to your Internet service provider or directly to your computer. We use the Internet Protocol address to download the pages you request to your computer;
2. The type of browser and operating system and the connection speed;
3. The date and time you visited this site;
4. The web pages or services you accessed at this site;
5. The website you visited prior to coming to this website; and
6. Search terms used on this site.

The information we automatically collect or store is used to improve the content of our web services and to help us understand how people are using our services. Bannockcounty.us and bannockcountyeventcenter.us use website logs to continually improve the value of the materials available on our sites. Website logs are not personally identifiable, and we make no attempt to link them with the individuals that browse bannockcounty.us and bannockcountyeventcenter.us.

Public Disclosure

The State of Idaho has enacted laws to ensure that government is open. Part of open government is ensuring that the public has a right to access appropriate records and information possessed by Bannock County. However, the same Idaho laws include exceptions that protect the disclosure of personally identifying information.

Information collected at this site becomes a public record that may be subject to inspection and copying by the public unless an exemption in law exists. As such, we limit information gathering to only that information which is necessary to deliver our services.
